Easter is the Queen of Festivals and I think that all who attended the Sunrise Service on Easter Morning must have shared a bit of the feelings and emotions of that first Easter Day. We were so blessed at St Twrog's to have a total of over 80 of our members present at our services on Easter Day. Yes the Lord has Risen indeed Alleluia.

This Year has been designated as the Year of Pilgrimage within our Diocese. 2023 sees the 900th anniversary of Pope Callixtus II's privilege given in 1123 that two pilgrimages to St Davids should be regarded as of equal value to one to Rome. Pilgrimage continues to grow in popularity among people of all faiths and none and I'm sure that Covid 19 has made people think in different ways about their general well-being. We plan to have a Parish Pilgrimage on Saturday 8th July leaving St Twrog's Church at 10a.m. Our Pilgrim Guide will be Janet Ingram the Pilgrimage and Education Officer at St David's Cathedral. Please come along to join us as I'm sure every single one of us will benefit from our time together.

Our Church St Twrog is also included in the 100 Objects Project organised by Revd Dr Caroline Jones. Our stained-glass windows are treasures and these have been reflected in the project.

I'm sure all of us are looking forward to better weather, longer days and time to be out admiring God's Creation. We take so many things for granted in our lives, our locality, our homes and families, friends and our health to name just a few. We have just witnessed the greatest story that ever was, about Jesus making the supreme sacrifice for us all. If we are to reflect Jesus in our lives, we should be ready to give all that we have for the good of our fellow men and women.

There is a story about a Japanese farmer who lived on the top of a little hill near the sea. The village was at the foot of the hill by the seashore. One day there was an earthquake. They were so common in Japan that no one took much notice of it. The houses rocked, and then all was still again. But the farmer,

watching from his doorway, saw that the sea was running a long way from the land. He was old and had seen this happen before and knew what it meant. There was no time to run down the hill to warn the village of its dangers. His voice was not nearly strong enough to carry so far. So, he seized a torch, and set fire to his own rice stacks. They made a tremendous blaze. All the villagers came running up the hill to see the fire. Then the sea came rushing back in a tremendous wave. It dashed over the village; it roared over the fields. But the people on the hill top were saved. The old man had saved them by sacrificing his property.

Unfortunately I think in Post Covid we have become ungrateful and at times selfish individuals. Let us focus therefore on the message and Good News of Easter and proclaim “Alleluia! Christ is risen. He is risen indeed. Alleluia!”

The Archidiaconal Stripping of the Jesse Tree service, held in February at St. Twrog, was well attended, with members from the churches attending taking part with readings and removing the various symbols from the tree. Refreshments were provided, time to catch up with fellow members, several saying how much they had enjoyed the service.

On 9th February we had an open meeting with Davina Davies, a member of the Carmarthen Guide Dogs for the Blind Group, and Ruth Evans, Co-ordinator for the Carmarthen Group and also Fund Raising Manager for Guide Dogs Wales. They came to talk about Guide Dogs for the Blind and Ruth took us through the history of the charity, the best breeds for the job, how they were trained and the importance of matching the dog with the blind person. Unfortunately there was no actual dog there as he had

been retired due to ill health. Davina has been waiting three years for a replacement which had made a big difference to her way of life and independence. There had been a big drop in the number of dogs available due to Covid and the restrictions of contact and therefore training. A collection was made.

February was a busy month with us taking part in the worldwide Wave of Prayer in church on the 25th.

In March we celebrated our Nawddsant Dewi with Cawl a Chan. We are very grateful to Marian and Idris who provided the tasty Cawl and to Vilna who led the entertainment.

25th March was Lady Day, The Annunciation to the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is an important day in the Mothers' Union calendar, which we marked with Holy Communion at 10am in church.

On Maundy Thursday members helped to clean shoes in the Post Office in Llanddarog - a reminder to those who came about the story of Jesus washing his disciples' feet. “WHAT A FRIEND WE HAVE IN JESUS”

This beautiful hymn was written by Joseph Scriven, a great Christian hero of mine. I met some wonderful Northern Irish Christian men who in 2010 were in Newcastle Emlyn for a Christian mission. To conclude the week of outreach there was a Songs of Praise event in Cenarth Church. One of the hymns sung by the Ulster men was "What a Friend we have in Jesus."

The men revealed the tragic story of the life of Joseph Scriven from Banbridge, Northern Ireland, a wealthy man whose fiancée died by drowning on the eve of their wedding. Joseph watched helplessly from the bank as the lady who had been on horseback drowned in the river.

Joseph Scriven was born on September 10, 1819. His parents had the financial means to pay for a good education and he graduated with a degree from Trinity College, Dublin. Scriven, a member, of the Plymouth Brethren, subsequently emigrated to Canada. He worked as a tutor to well-off families.

By the age of 25 his travels had taken him to Port Hope, Canada. He became highly regarded by people in that area. It was here that he met another lovely young lady, Eliza Roche and again fell madly in love. However, tragedy struck again and she died of pneumonia before they could wed.

On hearing that his mother was ailing and being unable to help her, he put his feelings into a beautiful poem.

On an occasion when Joseph had fallen ill, a friend who was visiting him discovered a poem near his bed and asked who had written it. Scriven said, "The Lord and I did it between us." He thought that the poem would bring spiritual comfort to his mother, who still lived in Ireland. Scriven had not intended that anyone else should see it.

Scriven, a staunch Christian, laboured sometimes for nothing and gave money and his clothing to those less fortunate than himself.

An editor read the poem and asked who had written the beautiful words and asked if he could publish them. When the poem was in print a hymn writer changed the title and set the lyrics to music.

Charles Converse, an attorney and composer wrote the musical setting used today.

*What a Friend we have in Jesus,
All our sins and griefs to bear!
What a privilege to carry
Everything to God in prayer!
O what peace we often forfeit,
O what needless pain we bear,
All because we do not carry
Everything to God in prayer!*

There was a very slight decrease in the planned giving. An increase shown in fees is largely due to more funerals and significantly more churchyard fees. The Parish Share shows a large increase in 2022 and a 50% increase in maintenance of the Church. An update was given on the various accounts, investments etc. Robert thanked our auditor Ruth Lewis and it was decided to retain her service.

The Vicar thanked Robert for his very comprehensive report and his care and dedication throughout the year. The report was adopted.

3 Adroddiad y Ficer/Vicar's Report presented by Canon Dewi Roberts

During the year of 2022 we experienced numerous blessings in the life of St Twrog. Rev. Jean Voyle Williams was licensed as Associate Priest and she had also celebrated 40 years of faithful and pastoral ministry at St Twrog.

There have been many memorable services during year: Vigil for Ukraine; Easter Celebrations; Platinum Jubilee; Harvest Thanksgiving and Christmas Worship. In September a Memorial Service of Thanksgiving for the life of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II was held. It was a delight to be able to visit the school again to conduct the weekly services on alternate weeks with Rev. Jean Voyle Williams. The project "Pentecost Experiences" held in conjunction with the school had been a very worthwhile experience for the children and the dedicated church volunteers.

He wished to thank all who contribute to the life of our Church, Jean Voyle Williams, the Officials, the Officers and the post holders.

During the year we had contributed to the Carmarthen Food Bank, the Ukrainian Appeal and Carmarthen County Council Toy Appeal.

In conclusion he stated that, during his long ministry, this period in Llanddarog had been his happiest.

Our Pilgrimage to Israel

(Daphne wrote of her personal pilgrimage for one of the Lenten Meditations this year – the theme of each of the meditations was pilgrimage – and all who took part thought others would like to hear her story.)

The story of my personal pilgrimage begins not with me but with my late husband, Selwyn, who worked on a Kibbutz and a Moshav in Israel for 9 months in 1963. Incidentally Israel is similar in size to Wales.

On the Kibbutz the families living there had no private property and no weekly wage packets. They organised communal mealtimes, education for their children, provision of clothing, books to read and daily work programmes. Individual living quarters provided personal privacy. The Kibbutz leased their land from the National Jewish Fund. Every member had an equal say in any decision making.

The Moshav was slightly different as each settler lived separately with his family on an average of 15 acres which the family would till and care for. Again the land was leased to the family from the National Jewish Fund. No hired labour was allowed as mutual help, neighbour to neighbour, was the guiding principle.

In 1963 settlements like these produced 75% of Israel's food and Israel exported huge amounts of citrus fruits. Selwyn saw dairy cattle being farmed very intensively and sheep breeding was becoming more popular. He worked with many different nationalities on the Kibbutz and made close friendships with both the Jewish families and those from other countries. Israel was a country of conflict then as it still is today and following the 1967 war several of the friends Sel had made were reported dead following the intense fighting.

In an article he wrote on his return Selwyn talks of his travels to places he knew from the Scripture stories he heard in Llanddarog School and in Sunday School in St Twrog. He describes the bible coming to life when he visited Nazareth, Capernaum, Jerusalem and the Sea of Galilee.

After this life-changing experience it was no surprise to me that Sel wanted me to visit Israel with him and he suggested that we go on our honeymoon! Unfortunately in 1982 Israel was on the news most days as the conflict between the Jews and Palestinians worsened. I was not brave enough to go so we went to Barbados instead! Another story altogether!

However, Sel continued with his plan to share Israel with me and a few years before I retired from teaching he told me that he had booked a cruise for us with Israel on the itinerary. He said to me 'You will be quite safe as we will be sleeping on the ship!' So we set off for the Eastern Mediterranean and one of our stops was the port of Ashdod, the gateway to Jerusalem. We first viewed the city from the Mount of Olives and visited a Kibbutz Hotel nearby for lunch.

Then we were able to visit the Wailing Wall or Western Wall as it is now known. It is the last remaining portion of Herod's Great Temple which the Romans demolished in AD70. Men and women are segregated and each person has the opportunity to place a prayer on a small scrap of paper and then embed it in the wall which is an important symbol of Jewish hopes for a restored nation.

We walked through the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus was praying when he was arrested and then we moved on to the Via Dolorosa 'the Sorrowful Way' and followed the Stations of the Cross which was a truly moving experience. We arrived finally at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in the Christian Quarter of the old city of Jerusalem. This Church is said to mark the location of the crucifixion, burial and resurrection of Jesus. The Church of the Holy Sepulchre contains a number of chapels and shrines and is treasured by a number of different religions and sects, including Roman Catholic, Greek Orthodox, Armenians, Syrians and Ethiopians. They all share the space. The Chapel of the Cross marks Calvary and the tomb of Christ is covered by another small chapel, both most holy Christian sites. I found visiting the Church both spiritually and emotionally uplifting.

After Jerusalem we passed through the city walls into Palestinian territory and visited Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus and the Church of the Nativity in Manger Square. I must say that I didn't feel so safe here and the poverty of the Palestinians was both evident and overwhelming.

We returned to the ship overnight and the next morning we arrived in the port of Haifa. A bus tour took us around the Sea of Galilee visiting Nazareth where Jesus grew up, Capernaum where he preached, Cana the site of the Wedding

Feast and perhaps my favourite place, the Church of the Multiplication of Loaves and Fishes in Tabgha at the foot of the Mount of the Beatitudes. *On the floor of the Church is an ancient mosaic depicting a basket of loaves and two Sea of Galilee mullet.* As we travelled around the Sea of Galilee it was so easy to imagine Jesus speaking from a boat in one of the little bays with crowds sitting around listening on the shore.



It was truly a wonderful pilgrimage to walk in the footsteps of Jesus and his followers and it was so uplifting that a few years later we did it again as part of a cruise! This time we spent the first day visiting the Judean Desert, the

Masada and the Dead Sea. The Masada is a mountain which rises high above the Dead Sea and was the final palace of King Herod the Great, King of Judea and the same Herod who tried to kill the baby Jesus.

Visiting the Dead Sea was another day to remember as I lay in my swimsuit on the salty waters with Selwyn watching fully clothed from the shore and then couldn't put my feet down to stand until a Swiss gentlemen rescued me! Selwyn often joked that I was the only person to have nearly drowned in the Dead Sea but the lesson is that you should never go in to bathe on your own. A much happier experience was paddling in the River Jordan close to the spot where Jesus is said to have been baptised by John the Baptist.

On our final day in Israel I had gained enough confidence to agree to travel independently by public service bus from Haifa to the Kibbutz where Sel had worked in 1963. Our knowledge of Hebrew was negligible but we managed to make ourselves understood and after a couple of hours travelling we finally arrived at the Kibbutz. We saw the communal facilities including the school, the chapel and the orange groves surrounding the settlement. We chatted to some people who were relatives of the families Selwyn had worked alongside nearly fifty years before. This meant so much to him and as we later waited at the bus stop to make the return trip to Haifa and to the ship, Selwyn shed a few tears. He explained that his feeling of sadness was because he would never visit Israel again, the country so close and so dear to his heart.

It is certainly a country very close to all our hearts and it was a privilege to visit and to savour the sights, sounds and the beauty of the Holy Land. I am so glad that Selwyn persuaded me to go and consequently whenever I listen to the readings in Church I am transported back to the places we visited as I recall my memories of the time we spent together in Israel.

Each pilgrimage was one to treasure and enabled me to deepen my own personal faith, giving me personal anecdotes to share with the children I taught in the Model Church in Wales School. I felt that I was able to enrich the stories of Jesus by describing the various locations to them.

I'd like to end with two verses from St. Matthew, Chapter 4:

“And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and preaching the Gospel of the Kingdom and healing all manner of sickness

.....

And there followed him great multitudes of people from Galilee, from Jerusalem and from Judea. and from beyond Jordan.”
